PROTOCOL INFORMATION						
Step 1	Microchipping (Speak to your vet)	All pets must have an ISO approved microchip implanted subcutaneously. Tattoos are not accepted. Please inform your consultant if your pet has more than 1 microchip.				
Step 2	Vaccinations (Speak to your vet)	Your pets must have 2 (two) rabies vaccine shots. The second rabies vaccination must be administered prior to the expiration of the first rabies vaccination. Both rabies vaccinations must be valid when the pets arrive. Acceptable vaccines include Zoetis Defensor 3, Nobivac Rabies and Merial Rabisin and must be older than 30 (thirty) days but not older than 12 (twelve) months. Dogs should be vaccinated against Distemper, Hepatitis, Leptospirosis, Parvovirus, Adenovirus, Kennel Cough/ Bronchicine and parainfluenza. Cats should be vaccinated against Feline Panleukopenia (Distemper), Viral Rhinotracheitis Calicivirus, Pneumonitis, BB-Intranasal and Leukaemia and should be older than 30 (thirty) days but not older than 12 (twelve) months.				
COUNT 30 DAYS FROM DATE OF RABIES VACCINATION (COMPULSARY WAITING PERIOD)						
Step 3	RNATT (Speak to your vet)	The titre test can be administered at the same time of the second rabies vaccination or later. Results must be greater than 0.5 IU/ml. Samples must be processed at Onderstepoort. The titre test is valid for 12 (twelve) months after the blood sample collection.				
Step 4	Veterinary Health Certificate (VHC) (Speak to your vet)					

Step 5	Submission to Petwings	The following documents must be submitted to Petwings: 1. Original, unaltered vaccination booklet for each pet 2. Original microchip certificate for each pet 3. Original Veterinary Health Certificate (VHC) for each pet 4. Original RNATT test for each pet (Microchip ID must be noted on all the above documents) On the day of departure Petwings will submit these documents to the South African State Vet for certification and endorsement.
Step 5	Clearance at destination (Petwings can advise you)	It is advised that your pets arrive at their destination during the week and preferably during normal office hours. This will ensure timely clearance through Customs and the presiding State Veterinarian while avoiding additional charges. Where applicable and unless stated otherwise, the consignee is responsible for import Permit, Import Customs, and Clearance at destination.

Other important notes to consider

China requires that puppies and kittens be vaccinated no earlier than 3 (three) months and wait for 30 (thirty) days before starting the export procedure.

- For your pet's comfort during travel we encourage you to include a favourite blanket, soft toy, or old T-shirt with your scent which we will place in their travel box.
- Chemical and other strong sedatives are NOT ALLOWED.
- Mild herbal remedies such as Rescue, CalmEze, catnip spray or other valerian root extracts are permitted.

Please inform your Petwings consultant of any brachycephalic (snub nose) pets travelling as certain airline, routing and seasonal restrictions may apply.

Please make sure all documents are under the owner's passport with full first, middle and last names.

The owner must pick up the customs declaration form upon arrival, which must be signed and stamped by an Airport Customs Officer - customs clearance **cannot** be completed without it.

Pets must arrive in China no later than 6 (six) months after their owner's arrival.

Dogs banned in Beijing: Mastiff, German Pinscher, St. Bernard, Great Dane, Great Pyrenees, Bernese Mountain Dog, Rottweiler, Weimaraner, Setter, Afghan Hound, Foxhound, Bloodhound, Irish Wolfhound, Saluki, Greyhound, Borzoi, Basenji, Australian Shepherd, Belgian Shepherd, Bouvier des Flandres, Bearded Collie, Scottish Shepherd, German Shepherd, Old English Sheepdog, British Bulldog, Chow Chow, Dalmatian, Keeshond, Japanese Akita, Newfoundland Sled Dog, Bedlington Terrier, Bull Terrier, Kerry Blue Terrier.

Dogs banned in Chengdu: Mastiff, Pit Bull Terriers including American Staffordshire Terriers and Staffordshire Bull Terriers, Akita, Dogo Argentino, German Shepherd, Chinese Chongqing, Borzoi, Newfoundland, Cane Corso, Central Asian Shepherd Dog, Great Dane, Dog de Bordeauz, Fila Brasileiro, Irish Wolfhound, Caucasian Shepherd, Kumming Wolfdog, Chinese Dog.

Dog breeds and their mixes banned in Shanghai: Tibetan Mastiff, Mastiff, Rottweiler, Italy Twisted Boli Dayton (Neopolitan Mastiff, Italian Mastiff alias), Bordeaux Mastiff (Dogue de Bordeaux, French Mastiff alias), Bull Mastiff, Spanish Mastiff, Caucasian Dogs (Caucasian Ovcharka), Pyrenean Mastiff, Brazil Rockefeller (Fila Braziliero, alias Brazilian Mastiff), Dogo Argentina Mastiff (Argentinean Dogo Mastiff), Horse Mastiff (Danish Broholmer) and other Mastiff descent, and hybridization with dogs; Beauceron Wolfdog, Kunming Wolfdog, China Dog, German Shepherd Dog, English Bulldog, Old English Bulldog, American Bulldog, Japanese Tosa, Bull Terrier, Doberman.
